The Mission of Adult Education and Transition Programs (AETP)

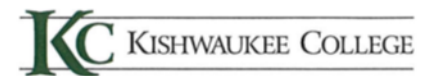

Work-Based Learning

Students gain work experience in their chosen field with a local employer. Students learn the ins & outs of what working in the field is like on a day-to-day basis and how the skills and information they are learning in their classes are directly linked to the work world.
